## Course Description

This course investigates British literature from the mid-19th century onwards to consider its aim to look at the every-day, often mundane aspects of life and describe life 'as it really is', engaging especially with questions on the representation of labor and social class in Britain. While much of the course literature is concerned with the period of industrialization in Britain, over the course of the seminar it moves on to the later 20th century to think about the relationship between fiction and late-stage capitalism. The texts in the seminar largely consist of prose fiction but also include plays and films.
