Course Description

This course is part of the Laurea Magistrale degree program and is intended for advanced level students. Enrollment is by permission of the instructor. The course provides students with the most up-to-date methods of analysis of the literary text. In particular, it focuses on the reception of authors and works that have gained success through international circulation and on the cultural impact of the images and models of "Italianness" that they promote. Italian literary and audio-visual products circulate in various markets, spreading – at national and international levels – images and models (stereotypes and/or counter-stereotypes) of "Italianness". Such images of Italy are tightly connected to the processes through which cultural products reiterate certain privileged aspects of Italian life: politics, crime, religious institutions, landscapes, cultural heritage, food, lifestyle, fashion, the entertainment industry, etc. The student possesses in-depth knowledge of Italian women's literature and is able to apply practical methodologies for the analysis and the interpretation of the literary text.
