Course Description

This seminar explores the complex intersections of gender, nationhood, and emancipatory notions in contemporary Iran. The course critically engages with how Iranian women have historically navigated, contested, and redefined the meanings of feminism, resistance, and agency within varying political, religious, and cultural landscapes. Topics include: politics of veiling and unveiling, the role of women in protest and revolution, and the intersections of gender with class, religion, and sexuality. Emphasis is placed on Iranian women as intellectuals, activists, artists, and everyday agents of change.
